Rules:

- ❖ Working Hunter and Dressage Classes are also open to non Connemara ponies
- ❖ Non IPS / NPS / BSPS members pay for daily membership at a charge of €5 per rider + €5 per owner, with their first, entry payable with entries.
- ❖ Date of Birth as of 01/Jan/11 in all classes
- ❖ All classes run under IPS rules and the decision of the appeals committee in all classes will be final.
- ❖ All objections must be lodged in writing and submitted within 30 minutes of class completion with €50 objection fee. This fee will be returned should the objection be upheld.
- ❖ Connemara Ponies competing in Mountain and Moorland classes (512 and 514) must not exceed 148cms in order to conform with Breed standards. This height restriction does not affect either Connemara or any other classes.

Note:

- ❖ Random Drug testing of competing animals and competitors may take place at the discretion of the Irish Sports Council, I.P.S., HSI or the Connemara Pony Breeders Society.

N.B. Championship Final Rules:

- Riders and Ponies must have qualified at approved shows.
- Competitors must produce Connemara Passports at Final.
- Birth Cert. for Under 16 riders to be produced on day of Final
- Fence Heights at Final **Under 16** 2.9” (84cms) **Over16** 3” (92cms)
- Stallions, with IPS / NPS/ BSPS council permission may compete riders over 14 only.
- Stallions although qualifying through regular ridden classes will be competing in their own Ridden Final (F) at Championship Finals.
- Stallions will be ineligible to compete in classes A , B & C.

OUGHTERARD SHOW SOCIETY REGULATIONS

1. All exhibits must be bona fide property of exhibitor and in the Home Craft classes, must have been made by the exhibitor and not previously exhibited at the Oughterard Show. In the produce classes, exhibits must have been produced in the exhibitors farm or garden.
2. Competitors are responsible if entered in classes which clash.
3. Exhibitors must satisfy themselves that their exhibits are in correct classes and bear correct number before judging commences.
4. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be on time for the judging of their class.
5. The judges are empowered to withhold prizes in classes in which there is not sufficient competition or merit.
6. The judges' decisions as to the merit in all classes shall be final. Any objections should be lodged in writing with the secretary within 30 minutes following the completion of the competition, with a fee of €50, which will be returned if the objection is upheld. €50 per person per objection.
7. The judges shall have the power to have prize winning animals examined by a V.S, whose certificates shall be limited to the statement "Sound" or "Unsound". Soundness being a necessary qualification in every case. The Veterinary examination shall be precisely such as the animal would be submitted for an intending purchaser.
8. The committee will not be responsible for any loss or accident which may occur to exhibits, exhibitors or to the general public.
9. All Horse & Ponies and especially Foals must be shown in headstall, cavessons and / or to be led in bridle only. All cattle must be in headstalls.
10. In the interest of safety all animals must be led by competent adults.
11. No person shall be allowed to enter the judging ring in any class except the stewards of that class and those in charge of the animals. No steward shall officiate in any class in which he is an exhibitor, or wear his/her stewards badge while showing such exhibit. Any exhibitor interfering with the judging will be disqualified.
12. Show grounds open at 8.30am. Exhibits must be on show in the Community Centre before 11.00am. Exhibits must not be removed before 5.00pm without written permission from the Show Secretary.
13. The person to whom a cup is awarded shall give security to the committee that the cup shall be delivered to the secretary at least 14 days prior to succeeding show, and in the same condition as it was received.
14. **All entries must be lodged with the Entries Secretary, by Thursday August 18th 2011 - Numbers to be collected in secretary's office on show day. No Refund given on any Entries.**
15. Winners of confined sections may enter in open sections.
16. Market Gardeners shall not be eligible for garden produce classes.
17. Factories shall not be eligible for home crafts section.
18. Bakeries shall not be eligible for cookery classes.
19. No Refund will be given on any exhibits/non exhibits.
20. No animal or exhibitor should enter the ring wearing a rosette, except in a Championship.
21. 5% will be deducted from prize money in the Cattle, Pony, Horse, Sheep Section for the ISA Championship fund.
22. Should any matter arise not provided for in the preview of these rules and regulations the same shall be referred to the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final from which there is no appeal.
23. Prize money in the horse section will be held back until the Champion Horse of the Show is held in the hope of encouraging 1st prize winners to participate in the Champion Horse of the Show.
24. Classes with 2 entrants or less will be **cancelled**. The entry fee will be returned.

GENERAL RULES FOR ISA CHAMPIONSHIPS 2010

A. ELIGIBILITY OF SHOWS

Shows wishing to participate in the 2011 Championships and be eligible to hold qualifiers, must have collected the Championship Fund Levy (currently 5%) from Horse, Pony, Cattle & @ Sheep class prize money for the year 2008 and forwarded the amount so collected, in full to the Irish Shows Association Head Office within the stipulated period of not more than 30 days from the date of their show. Alternative methods of meeting this obligation are not acceptable.

Any show or competitor in breach of the Rules set out below will be disqualified from the participating or competing in these Championships.

These General Rules and those relating to individual championships (where applicable) should be published in the show schedule and catalogue of the participating shows and must be strictly observed.

B. QUALIFYING ROUNDS (QUALIFIERS)

Qualifying rounds will take place at eligible shows selected by the Irish Shows Association.

C. RESPONSIBILITY OF SHOWS HOLDING QUALIFYING ROUNDS

- a. Selected shows should hold a separate class for each qualifier from which the highest placed animals will qualify.
 - b. The Qualifier Class should be held as the (1st) class in the relevant section of the show.
 - c. No other sponsor may be involved in qualifying classes.
 - d. Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held strictly in accordance with the relevant Rules.
 - e. Shows may charge an entrance fee for each qualifying class. The ISA will award a rosette to the successful animal(s) on appearance **At the Final**.
 - f. No show may hold a qualifying class for any championship on the day of the final.
 - g. Animals qualified for Finals are not eligible to enter in any other Show class where the Final is held.
 - h. Shows **must** appoint competent, well briefed persons to act as Stewards, who must ensure that only animals (or other exhibits) which are eligible to compete and whose documentation is in order, are allowed to proceed to the judging ring.
 - i. Animal passports must be read by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the show.
 - j. On completion of judging, Stewards must instruct the successful competitors to attend at the show secretary's office **within one hour**, and to complete the necessary documentation for entry to the championship final.
 - k. The show must appoint a well briefed officer who will be in attendance at the secretary's office, and who will assist exhibitors to complete the necessary documentation for participation in the final and to collect the relevant entrance fee.
 - L. **Show Secretaries must forward completed result cards, together with appropriate fees to the Irish Shows Association within (3) days following the holding of the show.**
- NB: Shows must return result card marked "No Qualifier" for any or all of the events for which no animal (or exhibit) has been selected.**

D. RESPONSIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS

- a. Exhibitors accept that the judges decision is final in all cases. Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated. Where a dispute or case for complaint arises, the matter should only be dealt with under f. below.

- b. **Winners of Qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their animals (or exhibits) for the final in accordance with j. and k. above, within one hour of qualifying.**
- c. Winners of qualifiers will compete in the final.
- d. The Irish Shows Association in conjunction with the sponsor reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of any competition as may be necessary or appropriate.
- e. **Shows and competitors must contact the National Irish Shows for details of any championships and not the sponsor involved.**
- f. **Objections must be lodged in writing with the ISA representative at the show or the show secretary within half an hour following the completion of the judging., together with a fee of €50, or other stated fee, which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.**

E. RESPONSIBILITY OF SHOWS HOSTING CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS

- a. A deduction of 5% of the prize money is to be collected by the show and forwarded to the Irish Shows Association within **30 days of the final.**
- b. Championship finals must start **not later than 2pm on the day of the show** and the advertised time of starting **must** be adhered to as far as practicable. If necessary other show classes should be either postponed or relocated to allow for this.

NOTICES OF INTEREST TO CHAMPIONSHIP PARTICIPANTS

IRISH LAW (EU DIRECTIVE)

Under Irish Law all horses moving from one location to another must be accompanied by their passports. It is in your own interest to ensure that this is the case. Failure to do so is an offence under Irish Law and is liable on summary conviction to result in a fine up to €3,000. All passports must be registered with the name of the current owner.

Embryo Transfer: Where a foal is produced by this method the dams passport must bear a declaration dated, stamped and signed by the stallion owner (or accredited practitioner where AI is involved) stating the date on which the dam was last covered (or inseminated) and the name of the covering stallion.

The owners of Champions and Reserve Champions are invited to submit the animals passports to the ISA head office where the placing will be endorsed and officially stamped with the seal of the Irish Shows Association as a permanent record.

It is in the interest of shows hosting championship finals that photographs and results are forwarded to the Irish Farmers Journal immediately following judging.

Important Notice to Animal Owners Involved in Showing Animals.

The Irish Shows Association would advise all animal owners who have their animals insured to have the Insurance Cover extended to cover them while showing Animals as Show, we understand that it costs very little or nothing at all dependant on who you have the insurance cover with.

If you are one of the few who don't have the cover we would advise that you think about putting it in place for this purpose, it may well be worthwhile. This advice is given to protect yourselves in the event of your animal lashing out, injuring someone, damaging property, If this was to happen, and it is established that your animal was out of control you be held responsible, or partly responsible for any damage of injury caused and end up paying all, or part of any settlement reached.

Rules for Powers Quarry 2011

1. Qualifying rounds will be held at designated shows.
2. Ponies 4 years old and over are eligible.
3. More than one pony in each qualifying class may be selected to compete in the final provided the judges agree that the standard is high enough.
4. Pony and / or Rider once qualified are not eligible to participate in subsequent qualifiers. This rule may be waived by the Show Committee in exceptional circumstances e.g. sale of a pony or injury of rider prior to final. Permission from the Oughterard Show Committee must be granted prior to any previously qualified pony or rider competing in subsequent qualifying rounds. Failure to do so will result in the entry not being accepted.
5. On completion of judging at qualifiers the successful qualifier will be given all relevant entry documentation by the ring steward. This must be completed and returned, along with the appropriate fee, to the secretary of the Oughterard show within 7 days- this rule will be strictly adhered to.
6. The Connemara Passport of each pony must be presented prior to judging at the qualifying show and on the day of the final.
7. The rider must be under 18 years on 1/01/11.
Birth certificates must be produced for inspection at qualifying rounds and on the day of the final.
8. Registered Connemara Stallions must be ridden by rider over 14 years and under 18 years on 01/01/2011.
9. Ponies must be registered in a main Connemara Studbook.
10. Jumping over plain rustic fences will be part of the qualifying rounds and final. Qualifying rounds require 2 fences, The Final requires 4 Fences. Jumps should not exceed 90cms in height and 90cms in width. Entrants from shows who do not adhere to this rule will not be accepted.
11. Ponies to be ridden in a Plain Snaffle, Pelham or Double Bridle. Boots are allowed for the jumping phase only, and must be removed prior to the in-hand or Flat Sections. Martingales and Spurs are prohibited.
12. A performance judge must be used at qualifying shows.
13. Ponies will be judged on type, Confirmation, Jumping technique, way of going and action in-hand.
14. Random Dope testing may be carried out on the day of the final.
15. Any objection must be lodged in writing with the show secretary within half an hour following the completion of the competition, together with €50 which is refundable if the objection is upheld.
16. The Oughterard show committee, in consultation with the sponsor reserves the right to amend the rules as may be deemed necessary.

2. The competition is open to either Colt or Filly Foals.
3. Dams passports must be produced at qualifying shows and at the final. Foals passports/stallion owners covering certificates must be produced at final.
4. Foals **must** be led at all times.
5. On completion of judging, Stewards must inform the successful competitor to visit the secretary's office at the qualifying show within one hour and complete the necessary documentation for entry to the final.

NOTE: it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to make sure his/her foal is entered for the final.

6. Show Secretaries must forward complete result cards, together with appropriate fees to the Oughterard Show Secretary within 5 days of holding the qualifying class.
7. Winners of Qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their qualifier (or exhibit) for the final, within one hour after the time of qualifying.
8. The Oughterard Show in consultation with the sponsor reserve the right to amend the rules as may be necessary.

It is envisaged that this competition will give a new impetus to Irish Draught breeding and encourage farmers to produce quality Irish Draught stock on western farms.

All sheep must be individually identified with plastic ear tags issued in accordance with the requirements of the National Sheep Identification System (NSIS)

Movement Documentation

All consignments of sheep being moved must be accompanied by a completed dispatch document. Individual details of each sheep in the consignment must be recorded on the document. Only sheep from non-restricted flocks can be moved to shows. In the case of flocks restricted following diagnosis of scrapie, only sheep possessing the ARR/ARR genotype may be exhibited. The movement of these ARR/ARR genotype sheep must be accompanied by the relevant movement permit (SCR/10), which can be obtained from the local District Veterinary Office in the County where the flock is located.

Flock Register

All movements of sheep to and from shows must be recorded in the keeper's flock register.

Exports to Northern Ireland

All sheep must be accompanied by a traces intra trade certificate for ovine animals. A traces message, corresponding with the traces certificate, will be sent for each animal or consignment being dispatched to the show (this will be performed by Department officials of the DVO). Exhibitors are advised to contact the show society at the destination well in advance of any show to determine the suitability of the show for return of animals (eg premises and sheep status), and whether the authorities will have officials and veterinary staff present to supervise and process documentation for animals returning to origin.

Agreement for the movement and immediate return of sheep to a show in another country or vice versa currently only applies for movements between Ireland and Northern Ireland - it does not apply for movements to Great Britain or further afield. Movements to shows in countries other than Northern Ireland, will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis and you should contact your local District Veterinary Office at least one month prior to the show

Attendance of sheep from scrapie monitored flocks at show and sales in 2011: Shows between 1st May and 31st October.

Sheep from scrapie monitored flocks will be permitted to attend Agricultural Shows taking place between 1st May and 31st October, without restriction or separation from other categories of sheep.
